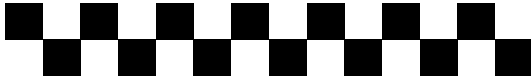

## HOW TO REGISTER

### Registration Information:

Children ages 6-12 from Enfield are invited to participate in the Race. An adult must be committed to assist the driver for the 3-4 sessions it will take to build the car. The adult does not need to have carpentry skills. There are 24 cars and 2 children to each car.

**Only 48 entrants will be chosen.**

### Soap Box Car Kits:

Standardized Soap Box kits will be provided to give all the children racing an opportunity for a fair and equal race. Children can build their cars from preset plans with templates or can be creative with the design of their cars. Kits include an automotive style steering mechanism, wheels, plans, templates and all parts needed to build a racer.



### How the Race Works:

Two drivers will take turns pushing and steering through the obstacle course. The course will include a race track with various obstacles. Trophies will be awarded to the first place winners in each division. All participants will receive a participant ribbon and t-shirt.

## MISSION OF THE RACE

In addition to raising money for ERfC, providers of after school initiatives in Enfield, CT, the Soap Box Derby is designed to focus on family fun.

***The emphasis of the Soap Box Derby is based on participation—not winning.***

We believe that this event will teach children workmanship, the spirit of fun competition, and give them the necessary determination to complete a project.

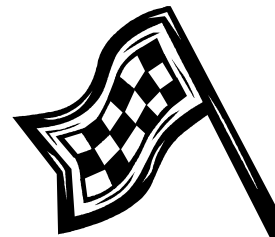
